CSX Operations in Georgia

- Operates and maintains nearly 2,700 miles of track*
- Maintains nearly 2,030 public and private grade crossings
- Handled nearly 2 million carloads of freight on the state's rail network
- At the end of 2015, CSX employed nearly 3,000 people
- Throughout 2015, CSX reported nearly \$270.9 million in compensation for employees**
- In 2015, CSX invested more than \$106.2 million in its Georgia network. In addition, the company invested more than \$1 billion in freight cars and other rolling assets to serve customers throughout its rail system.
- CSX carries a variety of commodities important to our economy and way of life, including consumer products, automobiles, food and agriculture products, and coal. Major commodities produced or consumed within the state include containerized consumer goods, aggregates, coal, light trucks, and feed grain.

CSX and the Georgia Community

 In partnership with state and local economic development agencies, Georgia businesses invested nearly \$105.7 million in new or expanded rail-served facilities on CSX or its connecting regional and short lines in 2015.



- CSX has designated Belfast Commerce Centre in Richmond Hill and Callaway South Industrial Park in LaGrange as "Select Sites," which are rail-served, ready-to-build locations for industrial development and expansion. The "Select Site" program is part of CSX's network-wide economic development initiative.
- In 2015, CSX sponsored a City Year service day in Savannah.
 Through its partnership with City Year, CSX brings its emphasis on safety and excellence to directly impact communities across the country.
- In 2015, CSX contributed nearly \$356,000 to organizations in Georgia, including the Georgia Research Alliance, Leadership Georgia Foundation, Woodruff Arts Center, Special Olympics Georgia, Georgia Natural Resources Foundation, and Georgia Operation Lifesaver.
