CSX Operations in New York

- Operates and maintains nearly 2,800 miles of track*
- Maintains more than 1,040 public and private grade crossings
- Handled more than 1 million carloads of freight on the state's rail network
- At the end of 2015, CSX employed more than 2,170 people
- Throughout 2015, CSX reported more than \$208 million in compensation for employees**
- In 2015, CSX invested more than \$146 million in its New York network. In addition, the company invested more than \$1 billion in freight cars and other rolling assets to serve customers throughout its rail system.
- CSX carries a variety of commodities important to our economy and way of life, including consumer products, automobiles, food and agriculture products, and coal. Major commodities produced or consumed within the state include containerized consumer goods, municipal and construction waste, light trucks, bleach and paper chemicals, and wheat.

CSX Facilities in New York

- Major rail yards in Selkirk, Syracuse, and Bronx (Oak Point)
- Intermodal terminals in Buffalo, East Syracuse, and Staten Island (Port Ivory on-dock terminal)
- TRANSFLO terminals in Albany, Bronx (Hunts Point), Buffalo, and Syracuse
- Automotive distribution center in Selkirk
- Division headquarters in Albany

Investment Projects

“Oak” and “Market” Improvements (Bronx)

- This project will upgrade the crossovers, rebuild track and increase clearances at the east and west ends of CSX's busy Oak Point Yard in the Bronx, improving the yard's ability to receive and process trains. The project is fully funded by Port Authority of NY/NJ, with funds administered through the New York State Department of Transportation.

CSX and the New York Community

- In partnership with state and local economic development agencies, New York businesses invested approximately \$440,000 in new or expanded rail-served facilities on CSX or its connecting regional and short lines in 2015. These investments will generate new jobs at those businesses.
- In 2015, CSX contributed more than \$603,000 to organizations in New York, including Friends of the High Line, Roswell Park Alliance Foundation, Memorial Sloan Kettering Cancer Center, FAN4Kids, and New York Operation Lifesaver.
