## NARROWBAND RADIO CONTACT LIST

Preparations for the conversion of railroad radio operations from wideband (25kHz) to narrowband (12.5kHz) continue. On July 1, and in adherence to a self-imposed rail industry mandate, railroads will need to have narrowband-capable radios in locomotives operated in runthrough service and/or at interchange locations. Beginning on January 1, 2011 and continuing through December 31, 2012, railroads will transition from wideband to narrowband transmission, on various dates and at various locations. And effective on January 1, 2013, wideband transmission will be prohibited by order of the Federal Communications Commission.
